

# HUSKY HALL OF FAME

## NOMINEE QUALIFICATION BYLAWS



Listed below are the nominee qualifications for the Husky Hall of Fame.

### A. GENERAL:

1. Consideration will be given for personal conduct in sports and/or contributions to the UW Athletic Department
2. Criteria and qualifications will be based upon the nominee's participation while attending or serving the University of Washington. However, accomplishments after leaving the University may be an important point of consideration.
3. The maximum number of inductees shall be eight (8). The selection committee shall review this maximum annually.
4. The inductee shall attend the induction banquet unless the selection committee has waived their presence and a proxy selected to receive his/her award. An individual chosen by the inductee's family shall represent all inductees who are deceased or incapacitated.

### B. INDIVIDUAL ATHLETES:

1. An athlete is eligible for nomination five (5) years from the end of the academic year in which he/she completed his/her eligibility.
2. Athletes must have participated at the University of Washington for two full seasons.
3. As a guide in selecting outstanding athletes, the following criteria should be considered to be of great importance (not listed in order of importance):
  - Winning an Olympic gold medal
  - Setting a world record
  - Membership on an Olympic team
  - Selection as an All-American
  - Winning a national championship
  - Recognition by a national hall of fame
  - Selection to a national team
  - Winning a conference championship

### C. TEAM:

1. A team is eligible for nomination five (5) years from the end of the academic year in which its regular season of competition was completed. Teams are defined as student-athletes and coaches only.
2. An athletic team shall be eligible for induction as one inductee. The induction of a team shall not prohibit the separate induction of one or more of its members. If a team is inducted, the selection committee shall select a representative(s) to accept the award.

### D. COACH:

1. As a guide in selecting outstanding coaches, the following criteria should be considered to be of great importance (not listed in order of importance):
  - Career record
  - National titles
  - National top-20 rankings
  - Development of program
  - National achievements (coach of the year, president of national coaches association, etc)
  - Development of student-athletes:
    - a. Number of national champions in individual sports.
    - b. Number of Olympians and/or record setters.
    - c. Number of All-Americans
  - Length of distinguished service
